### 2016 History Scholarship

Tay Valley Township is offering a \$1,000 scholarship to a student graduating from either the Perth and District Collegiate Institute or St John Catholic High School who has been accepted into a full-time, apprenticeship, college or university program, and who has demonstrated a keen interest in history.

Applications are to be directed to the school official coordinating bursaries and scholarships who will forward them to the History Scholarship Selection Committee.

Applications must be received by the Selection Committee by May 20, 2016.

Background information is to be submitted on the attached application form.

Along with the application form, the following is also required:

- 1. A statement, of about 500 words, outlining the candidate's view on the importance of studying history and why the candidate has chosen to follow the post-secondary program noted on the application.
- 2. A letter of recommendation from a school official.
- 3. A letter of recommendation from a person who is not a family member,

Note: selection may involve an interview.

The source of funding for this annual scholarship is the net proceeds from the sale of *At Home in Tay Valley*, an anthology celebrating the people, places and events in the history of Tay Valley Township, which was published in 2015 as one of Tay Valley Township's legacy projects celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Perth Military Settlement, and from the net proceeds from the sale of the 2016 calendar celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Perth Military Settlement, 1816-2016, plus donations by individuals.

Tay Valley Township has administers the funds for the history scholarship.

The selection committee, which consists of representatives from the Perth and District Historical Society, the Perth and District Public Library and the Regional Heritage Fair operates at arm's length from Tay Valley Township Council and staff.
