- If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision
 of the Council of the Corporation of Tay Valley Township to the Ontario Land
 Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a
 public meeting or make written submissions to Tay Valley Township before the
 by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the
 decision.
- If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to Tay Valley Township before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

- The Clerk must provide notice of Council's decision to all those who request a copy within 15 days after the day the by-law is passed. Anyone may appeal the decision to the Ontario Land Tribunal by filing with the Clerk within 20 days of the notice of decision.
- An appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal may be filed with the Clerk of the Township not later than 20 days after the day that the notice of decision was given. The notice of appeal must set out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection, accompanied by the required fee.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended:

"THAT, Zoning By-Law No. 02-021 be amended by changing the zoning of the lands at Part Lot 21 Concession 6, Geographic Township of North Burgess (Roll #0911-911-020-48036) known locally as 472 Star Hill Road, from Seasonal Residential (RS) to Residential Limited (RLS).

BACKGROUND

The application applies to an approximately 0.58-ha (143-acre) lot with 57.9m (190 ft) frontage on Black Lake.

The purpose of this application is to change the zoning from Seasonal Residential (RS) to Limited Services Residential (RLS). The effect of the amendment is to allow a new dwelling on a private road to be used as a year-round residence.

DISCUSSION

Provincial Policy Statement (PPS)

Section 1.1.1 Building Strong Healthy Communities - states that "Healthy, livable and safe communities are sustained by: a) promoting efficient development and land use patterns which sustain the financial well-being of the Province and municipalities over the long term...and c) avoiding development and land use patterns which may cause environmental or public health and safety concerns." This section can be met as the newly constructed dwelling exceeds the required 30m water setback.

Section 2.1 1 Wise Use and Management of Resources - Natural Heritage states that, "Natural features and areas shall be protected for the long term". Section 2.1 Natural Heritage is satisfied as the development is not anticipated to affect the lake as the 30m water setback is exceeded and a Site Plan Control Agreement is registered on the lot.

Section 2.2.2 Water states, "Development and site alteration shall be restricted in or near sensitive surface water features and sensitive ground water features such that these features and their hydrologic function will be protected, improved or restored". The 30m water setback from the lake has been exceeded for the lot.

The aquifers throughout Tay Valley Township are vulnerable to surface contaminants due to thin or absent soils overlying bedrock that may be fractured. Where these conditions exist, it

may be possible for contaminants to enter drinking ground water supplies. For this reason, care should be taken to avoid land uses and practices that may inadvertently lead to undesirable effects on groundwater.

Lanark County Sustainable Communities Official Plan

Section 3 Rural Land designation permits a variety of uses including residential uses.

Section 5.4.4 of the County of Lanark's Sustainable Communities Official Plan indicates that municipalities have an obligation to consider the impact of development and land use on waterbodies in order to ensure their long-term viability. This section is met as the developed area is more than 30m back from the lake.

Official Plan

The subject property is designated in the Official Plan as Rural. Section 3.6 Rural designation permits residential uses.

Section 2.24.1 Waterfront Development states that "An adequate water setback serves an important function in relation to the protection of natural and cultural heritage characteristics and water quality of the lakes and rivers of the Township. The intent of the water setback is to prevent the disturbance of the shoreline area as a result of the placement of buildings and structures, including sewage systems, or the removal of the soil mantle and natural vegetation. An appropriate water setback can reduce phosphorus and other nutrient loads to the lake and in combination with vegetation, prevent erosion and sedimentation." The dwelling exceeds the 30m required water setback.

Zoning By-Law

The lot is currently zoned Seasonal Residential (RS) and requires rezoning to Residential Limited Services (RLS) to allow a newly constructed dwelling to be used as a year-round residence. Lot coverage requirements are met as the lot coverage is 2.7%, and the Floor Space Index is 4%, both of which are significantly below the maximum of 10% and 12% respectively.

Planner

An existing Site Plan Control Agreement provides additional protection to the lake by ensuring a vegetative buffer along the shore and that runoff from the building is directed to the rear of the lot away from the lake.

Rideau Valley Conservation Authority (RVCA)

RVCA recommendations have already been included in a Site Plan Control Agreement.

Mississippi Rideau Septic System Office (MRSSO)

The applicant has installed a new septic system, approved by MRSSO.

CONCLUSION

The Planner recommends that the proposed amendment be approved to rezone the lands at Concession 6, Part Lot 21, 472 Star Hill Road, Geographic Township of North Burgess (Roll number 091191102048036) from Seasonal Residential RS to Residential Limited Services (RLS).



A BY-LAW TO AMEND ZONING BY-LAW NO. 2002-121, AS AMENDED (ANDERSON AND BECK – 472 STAR HILL ROAD) (PART LOT 21, CONCESSION 6, GEOGRAPHIC TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BURGESS)

WHEREAS, the *Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P.13 Section 34 as amended*, provides that the Councils of local municipalities may enact by-laws regulating the use of land and the erection, location and use of buildings and structures within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS, By-Law No. 2002-121 regulates the use of land and the erection, location and use of buildings and structures within Tay Valley Township;

AND WHEREAS, the Council of the Corporation of Tay Valley Township deems it advisable to amend By-Law No. 2002-121, as hereinafter set out;

AND WHEREAS, this By-Law implements the policies and intentions of the Official Plan for Tay Valley Township;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Council of the Corporation of Tay Valley Township enacts as follows:

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1.1 THAT, By-Law No. 2002-121 is hereby amended by amending the zoning from Seasonal Residential (RS) to Residential Limited Services (RLS) on the lands legally described as Part Lot 21, Concession 6, geographic Township of North Burgess, now in Tay Valley Township, County of Lanark (Roll # 091191102048036), in accordance with Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this By-Law.
- **1.2 THAT,** all other applicable standards and requirements of By-Law No. 2002-121 shall continue to apply to the subject property.
- **1.3 THAT,** this By-Law shall come into force and effect with the passing thereof, in accordance with *the Planning Act*, as amended.



Ontario Land Tribunal

Please be cautioned that if, at a later date, a person or public body choose to appeal Council's decision on this matter to the Ontario Land Tribunal, the Tribunal may dismiss all or part of an appeal without holding a hearing if the reasons set out in the appeal do not refer to land use planning grounds offended by the decision, the appeal is not made in good faith, or is frivolous or vexatious or made only for the purpose of delay.

The Tribunal may also dismiss the appeal if the appellant did not make oral submission at the public meeting or did not make written submission before the plan or amendment were adopted.

If you choose to appeal, you must submit written reasons, the prescribed fee and any other background material requested. This notice is not intended to discourage your objection in any way. It is intended only to inform you of your rights and obligations and to encourage early participation.

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



The dwelling exceeds the 30m required water setback.




